SILVER HILLS HONORS CLASSES

Silver Hills Middle School's honors classes are designed to challenge students and prepare them for advanced placement classes at the high school level. Honors classes are offered in Language Arts at all three grade levels. The second that enrollment is fluid and may change within a year and from year to year.



Honors classes are different from regular middle school core content courses in that they are taught at an accelerated pace with more depth and complexity. Classes frequently require the student to work at the analysis and synthesis levels of thinking within the content area. On occasion, honors classes may require more homework. As a result, the typical honors student is task-oriented, uses his/her time effectively, and maintains stellar attendance.

Student Responsibilities

- You agree to consistently come to school so your attendance is in good standing.
- You agree to email or talk with your teacher before, during, or immediately after an absence to get missing work and to complete it promptly.

Parent Responsibilities

Parental support is an essential component of a student's success in honors classes.

- You agree to support your student in their attendance, their work, and their self-advocacy.
- You agree to support the school and hold your student to high standards and to help them meet their responsibilities as outlined above.
- You agree to encourage your student to find an appropriate balance between academics and extracurricular activities.

- two teacher recommendations from current teachers; one being your current Language Arts teacher and one from a current core teachers.
